Language Paper 1 - Explorations in Creative Reading and Writing (50%)



Question 1

List four things... 4 marks 5 minutes

What's involved: To locate and retrieve explicit information.

- Highlight the focus in the question
- As you begin to read, write down your answers for question one
- Remember, full sentences only
- Don't make inferences focus only on the facts / copy directly from the source linked to the question focus

Question 3

Structure Analysis 8 marks 10 minutes

What's involved:

To explain how a writer uses structure for effect.

- Focus on the opening, middle and end of the extract Consider the effect it has on the reader
- Don't discuss language e.g. metaphors, simile, lexical choices
- Don't use phrases like 'this makes the reader want to read on' 'this intrigues the reader'
- Explain exactly what effect is created by each shift in focus - e.g. does this help the reader to learn/understand something, does it make them question something, feel pity/sympathy for a character? Why?
- HOME (Holistic Overview, Opening+Effect, Middle+Effect, End+Effect)



Question 2

Language Analysis 8 marks 10 minutes

What's involved: To explain how a writer uses language for effect.

- Read and highlight key words in the question
- Pick selective quotations that you can 'squeeze' a lot of analysis from - add furthermore/additionally/also to do this
- Zoom-in on key words and comment on their effect
- Consider exactly why a metaphor/simile has been used what qualities does the writer want to show by using it? E.g. strength vs. weakness
- SMILE x2 Statement, Method/Quote, Inference, Lexis Zoom, Effect

Question 4

Evaluation 20 marks 25 minutes

What's involved:

To create a balanced argument evaluating a statement presented about the text.

- Read and highlight key words in the question make sure you find the two parts of the viewpoint in the statement and evaluate both
- Agree with the statement. Disagree the statement if confident and relevant but don't force yourself to if you're not sure how/why
- Select relevant quotations
- Identify the technique used or zoom on key words and explain the effect
- Explain how the method/quotation you've chosen proves / challenges the viewpoint – link back to this at the end of every paragraph
- What, How, Why + Evaluation (link back to statement) x3

Question 5

Narrative / Descriptive Writing 40 marks (AO5 = 24, AO6 = 16) 45 minutes

Assessment Objectives:

- AO5: Communicate clearly, effectively and imaginatively. Organise information and ideas, using a range of methods and grammatical structures to support effectiveness of the text.
- **AO6:** Use a range of vocabulary and sentence structures for clarity, purpose and effect, with accurate spelling, punctuation and grammar.

What's involved:

To write a creative text, inspired by a prompt, to demonstrate narrative / descriptive skills.

Use the same character you have planned in lesson.

- Always plan your answer focusing how you can tweak a narrative written previously to meet the prompt
- Include only 1-2 characters max
- Write about a short moment of time and zoom in to tiny details
- Include a cyclical structure/motif at beginning and end
- Use show not tell to depict characters
- Describe setting to create atmosphere
- Use appropriate language methods
- Use sophisticated and impressive vocabulary
- Vary your paragraph length
- Vary sentence openers/punctuation
- Around and 2 and a half sides
